Talai Primary School is eager to join Real Medicine Foundation/Real Medicine Enterprises (RMF/RME) to bring the organisation's online learning platform (anYmo) to Baringo, Kenya.

We look forward to this week's training that will be provided by RME in partnership with the Principal at Talai Secondary School to equip our teachers with the tools to implement online education for our students (grades 1 to 8).

We anticipate that the high quality of courses and trainings under development, coupled with easy accessibility through RME's eLearning platform, could greatly benefit school administrators, teachers, and students, as well as government and NGO staff working in Baringo and beyond.

Baringo County is one of the 47 counties in Kenya and is home to over 800,000 people. The area is known for its rich culture, beautiful landscapes and the world's best distance runners, but also faces many challenges, including drought, a high level of poverty, limited employment opportunities for the youthful population, high rate of school dropouts and limited access to energy. Our mandate is to provide quality education, economic and social empowerment of marginalized groups, and sports activities for the youth. We are confident that our services will continue to improve the prospects of the next generation, equipping them with valuable knowledge and skills to build a productive and happy life. The partnership with RME and access to its online platform, anYmo, would be a valuable tool in furthering our goals, by strengthening the county's 672 schools and providing additional training to 3,190 teachers. Trainings could also be provided to administrators and to students. We are most interested in trainings on the following topics: HIV/AIDS, Nutrition, Menstrual Hygiene, Sports for Development, Vocational Training, and Gender Equality.

RME's sister organization, Real Medicine Foundation, has been supporting other regions in Kenya such as the health sector in Turkana County since 2009, and we have great respect for their work in drought relief; infrastructure improvement, medicine and medical equipment provision, training, and human resources support to Lodwar County & Referral Hospital; extensive nutrition and MCH health outreaches across three sub-counties, and their newest project of teaching HIV-positive mothers greenhouse farming and other skills to boost both their nutrition and economic status.

I look forward to seeing RME's innovative training platform take root and flourish in Baringo, Kenya, and Talai Primary School is excited to partner with RME in this endeavour.
